

PQMS Training COVID-19 safeguarding measures and controls

Our number one priority is the safety of PQMS Training staff and customers. As a responsible industry training provider, we will play our part in helping Britain overcome the COVID-19 pandemic.

On arrival:

Delegates will be asked about typical symptoms and exposure to COVID-19. If the training depot manager or the instructor considers it unsafe for you to attend i.e. you are displaying symptoms - you may be refused entry. This is at the discretion of the depot manager or the instructor to ensure the safety of PQMS Training staff and delegates in attendance.



Communication:

Covid-19 control measures will be discussed and agreed relative to the PQMS Training depot house rules, reference to signage as applicable and risk assessment.

Social Distancing:

The Government advice is to stay 2 metres (2m) apart and that is what our guidance is based on. Theory training rooms will be laid out, so delegates are not directly facing each other, and the



seating arranged 2 metres apart. As part of our continuous internal improvement, we have now installed barrier/sneeze screens for the safety of our staff and your delegates.



Health & hygiene:

We will provide hand washing facilities (soap and water) and alcohol-based hand gel in areas where washing facilities are not readily available; delegates will be encouraged to wash their hands regularly.

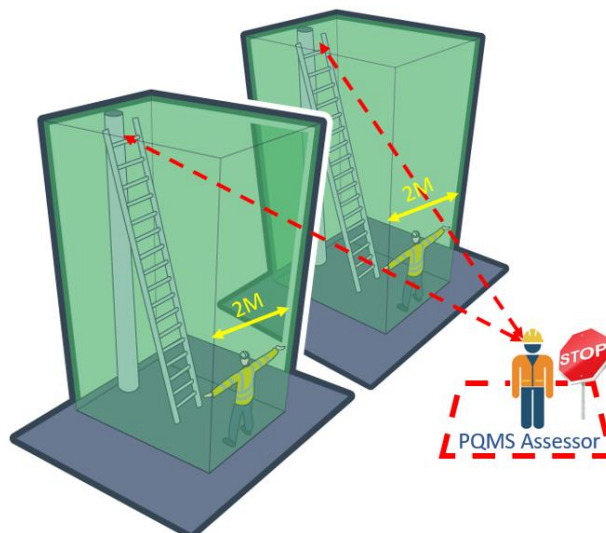
We have in place a fully tracked cleaning and disinfecting regime in all PQMS Training Depots.

Welfare facilities and canteens:

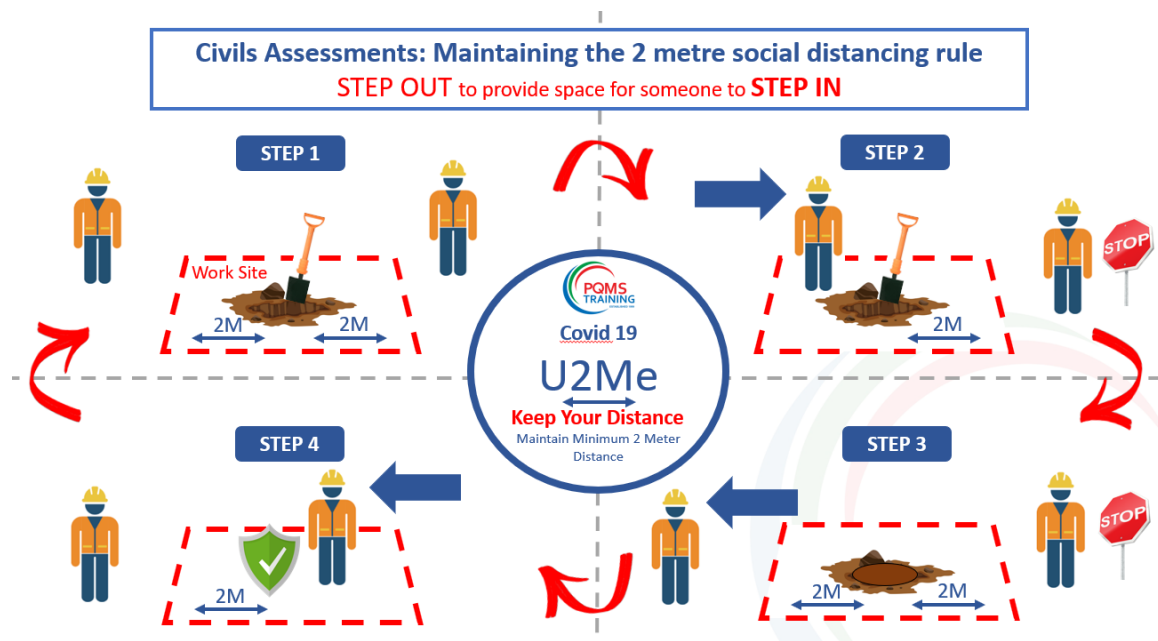
Delegates may make adequate use of canteen facilities and toilets; this will be controlled to maintain social distancing and hygiene. Please be advised PQMS have removed all tea and coffee making products, cups and mugs at this time through the covid pandemic.

Practical Facilities:

Floor areas will be marked to show delegates where to stand, ensuring social distancing is always adhered to; but also, to maximise their visibility and understanding of the practical training.



Where the social distancing requirements are unable to be maintained e.g. (demonstrating machine controls or intricate equipment detail) additional precautions like limiting the exposure time and wearing face coverings and gloves are utilised. Machine controls will be cleaned and disinfected between use by each delegate.



Virtual Classroom / E-Learning Courses:

PQMS Training are working with awarding bodies to develop and roll out out E-learning modules to allow workers / operators to maintain qualifications and licenses.

Delegates can complete all theory learning remotely via an e-learning module and follow up by attending an PQMS Training depot to complete their chosen practical training and assessment.

Course Scheduling:

To cope with the requirements of the pandemic class and practical sizes, PQMS training have increased our opening hours to support industry.

We are now open 7 days a week and have the facility to carry out courses after hours.
